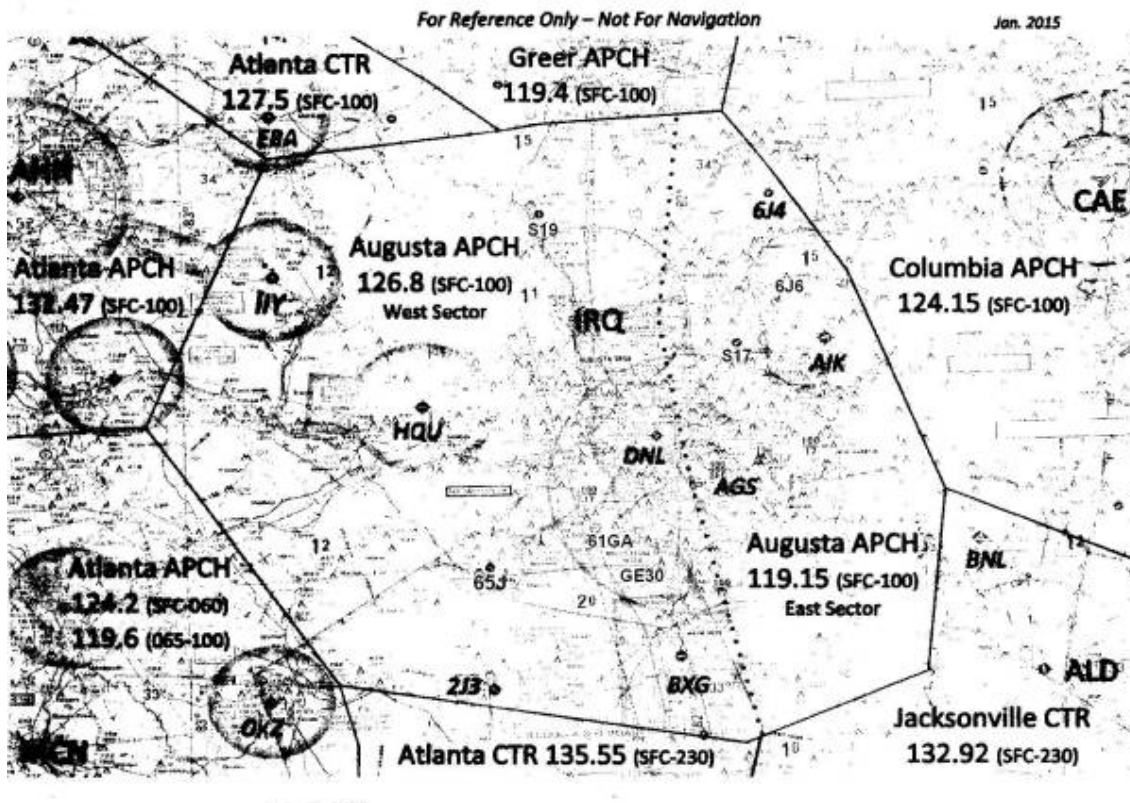

RIP Christopher "Chris" Christy

A&P/AI Daniel Field 1984 – 2007



Christopher “Chris” Christy was known by many of our club members as a friend and an A&P who serviced their aircraft over the years. After his career at Daniel Field in Augusta, Georgia, he had a new career with ERA Helicopters in Louisiana as a helicopter field mechanic on the 139 Augusta Aircraft from 2007 to 2014. In the spring of 2014 Chris had fallen off a helicopter in Louisiana. He recovered from that and was back to work for two months. Chris got sick again and cancer was found in his jaw in the early fall. He had most of it removed but succumbed to it as it had spread.

Larry Garner wrote “Chris was the first to work on my Cherokee in the Spring of ’84 and many times since. I’ve always said that Chris has forgotten more than most people know about ‘fixing’ airplanes. Always a smile, a chuckle and never a cross word for anything or anyone.”

Dudley Bowen wrote “Chris was a great friend and teacher to many of us. Without being pushy he could tell much to those inclined to listen and understand his manner.”

Tax time is here. EAA writes this about deducting expenses on your tax return due April 15, 2015. Note that the same information is applicable for any expenses you incur for the Boshears SkyFest as well as the Wrens fly-ins.

Thank you to everyone who volunteered at EAA headquarters in Oshkosh in 2014. Whether you volunteered at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh, the museum, or Pioneer Airport (or other areas), your efforts are greatly appreciated! Did you know that you may be allowed a federal and state income tax deduction for expenses incurred when volunteering at EAA headquarters? Expenses like transportation (including automobile mileage expense), lodging, and meals that you incur in connection with volunteer services performed on behalf of EAA may be fully or partially deductible as a charitable contribution on your personal income tax returns. To determine if you are allowed to deduct your expenses, EAA suggests that you consult with a qualified tax professional and review this [memorandum](#), which has been drafted by our legal counsel.
