AVIATION QUESTION OF THE MONTH

Answer to last month's question: *You are planning a cross-country flight with some friends in your flying club's tailwheel aircraft. You recently attained single-engine-landing currency in a Cessna 172. Must you also attain landing currency in a tailwheel aircraft to act as pilot in command for this flight?*

According to AOPA referencing the FAA: Yes. If you are planning to carry passengers in a tailwheel aircraft, and act as PIC, you are required to have performed at least three takeoffs and landings (to a full stop) in a **tailwheel aircraft** of the same category, class, and type (if required) in the past 90 days (see [14 CFR 61.57](#)). If you are not current, don't worry—getting legal is easy. Before your cross-country flight, do your currency landings (solo and to a full stop). Then top off your tanks, load up your passengers, and go flying.
