AVIATION QUESTION OF THE MONTH

Answer to last month's question: *Can a lady fly as pilot in command while she is pregnant?*

According to AOPA: The short answer is yes — there is no FAA restriction. Of course, she should always talk with her doctor about it and consider his or her advice. Also, an aviation medical examiner (AME) should have no problem issuing her a medical certificate as long as there are no complications with the pregnancy. There have been very few studies done on the risks of flying to the fetus — but those that have been completed found that flying while pregnant has no higher risk of miscarriage than staying on the ground. One of the greatest challenges she might encounter while flying during pregnancy is staying comfortable.

This Month's Question: Many pilots ask: "Must my aircraft stop flying at TBO (Time Before Overhaul)?" Most pilot/owners know that they are under no obligation to overhaul at TBO with their personal aircraft. However, there are exceptions to this where they must stop flying at TBO. What are they?
